PICKING UP PLANTS? DROPPING OFF POUNDS? DID YOU KNOW....

The transfer of any cannabis, plant or product must be conducted by a distributor with transport operational compliance, or a transport/self-transport licensee.

§ 5311. Requirements for the Transportation of Cannabis Goods.


The following requirements apply when transporting cannabis goods between licensees or licensed premises:

(a) Transportation shall only be conducted by persons holding a distributor license under the Act, or employees of those persons. All vehicles and trailers used for transportation shall be owned or leased, in accordance with the Vehicle Code, by the licensee. (this section continues...)

BPC 260313 CCR 8202(d) - Serious violation (\$1001-\$5000, up to loss of license)
Licensee transferred cannabis and nonmanufactured cannabis products from their his or her
licensed premises to another licensee without using a licensed distributor. (CDFA enforcement
section)

A transportation license is a BCC license, and applied for and held separately than cultivation or manufacturing. Humboldt County does allow for the approval of these licenses in conjunction with an extra box checked on the business license application.

There are additional requirements to be in compliance with transportation, and Oxalis has a guidance document as well as support service in applying for and operating a transportation license.
